Dear Parents and Carers

I hope you are all keeping warm in the cold snap we are having. Thank you for sending your children to school with the appropriate warm clothing so they are still able to get outside and enjoy the fresh air. Please rest assured that at this time of year we always carry out dynamic risk assessments and if we feel the ground is too icy and therefore dangerous, we will keep them inside.

Snow closures - if we need to close the school for snow, I will message parents asap on Seesaw after taking advice from the site manager and staff who live in the villages. This will only ever be a last resort, and we will always aim to open as normal or announce a delayed start to enable site staff to clear paths and staff that are travelling longer distances to get in safely

Finally, we are starting to see more and more children arriving at school late which is having a negative effect on their well-being and academic progress. Please remember that doors open at 8.35am and registration is at 8.45am. There is always a morning challenge on the board from 8.35 to 8.55am so those that are consistently late are missing this learning which may then feed into lessons during the day.

If there is a reason for this, please do get in touch and we can see if there is any support school can offer.

KS2 Cross Country

On Wednesday 13th November, Y3-6 competed in the next XC race at a new venue - Old Salts Rugby Club in Water Orton. Y3/4 raced 1400m and Y5/6 - 1900m, covering laps of the rugby fields. For the girls in Y3/4, Tess was first girl back in a fantastic 8th position out of over 70 runners. Shortly after came Nessa in 12th and Georgia in 13th, followed by Kezia (22nd), Imogen (30th), Robyn (52nd), Georgina (53rd) and Amelia in 57th. For the Y3/4 boys, Arlo was first back for us in 7th position, in an extremely fast-paced race, next home was Rafe in 21st, Rory in 25th, Max in 44th, Oscar in 51st and Chester in 58th. In the Y5/6 girls' race, our first girl home was Evie in 18th position. There was a battle between Tamworth Athletics Clubs rising stars Arabella and Amber, with Arabella coming in 44th place and Amber 54th, and Elsie B came in between them in 47th. The final race of the day was the Y5/6 boys. Jack M made his return to the competition, finishing in 25th spot, followed by Jacob M and Lincoln in 30th and 32nd. Next back in 36th was Dougie, followed by two new-to-cross-country Y5s, Ollie (43rd) and Lucas (48th). Well done to all that took part. The final race before Christmas is being held at The Pingles Stadium, Nuneaton on Wednesday 11th December.




